ALEXANDRA EXTER PAINTS is a collection of 16 essays on the artist's painting and works for the theatre between 1910 and 1924. The essays explore the colour theories that gave rise to her abstract painting and the basic laws of structure that gave order to her Cubist, Simultaneist, Non-Objective painting and her stage and costume design. Contemporary accounts of *Thamira Kitharides*, *Salome*, and *Romeo and Juliet* are included, together with extracts from Alexander Tairov's *Notes of a Director* of 1921.

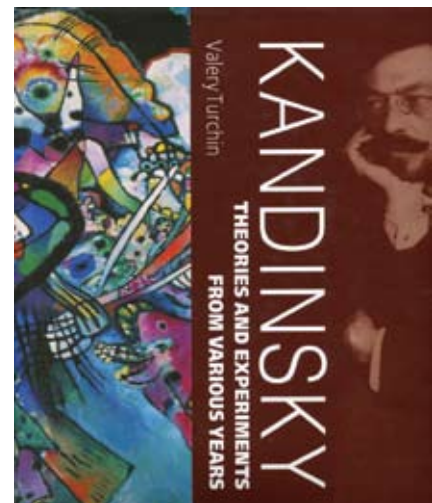

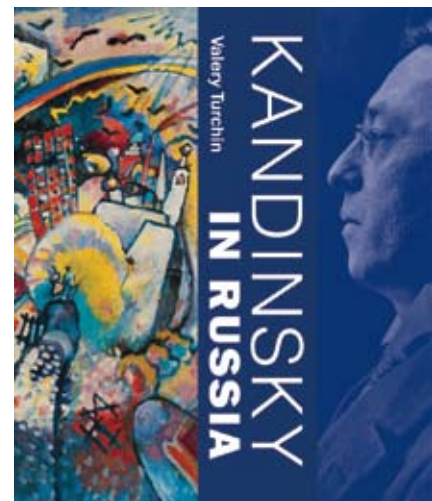
